



OST Narrative:

Out-of-School Time (OST) is the time that a child or youth spends in after school or summer programming. In Philadelphia, OST programs are provided for young people in grades pre-K through 12.

OST is important because it:

- Supports working parents and caregivers.
- Benefits a child's academic, social, and personal development.
- Helps children stay safe and avoid high-risk behaviors.

Programs are available throughout the city with a variety of activities to choose from, including:

- Creative and Performing Arts
- Athletics and Health
- Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM)

LEGACY's OST Out of School Time (OST) Program is uniquely designed to enrich lives and & expand minds, delivering a comprehensive curriculum: featuring Tennis, STEM, Nutrition, Character Building Lessons, Reading, Game-Based Learning & Homework Assistance.

Today, LEGACY proudly serves a total of 318 students and families, providing new employment opportunities for 35+ staff. We operate OST programming at three different Philadelphia schools, with four contracts in total: Alexander K. McClure, Overbrook Educational Center and Richard R. Wright. Program deliverables include: Social Emotional Learning (SEL), Literacy, Creative and Performing Arts and Athletic Development. Programming runs Monday - Friday, up to 3 hours per day. We also offer 6 weeks of Summer programming as well, Mon - Fri, up to 7 hours per day.

Legacy Youth Tennis and Education hosts summer camps in over 25 neighborhood parks throughout Philadelphia's urban and suburban areas. Our Community Tennis Summer Camp program provides seven weeks of top-notch tennis instruction, life skills and mentor-ship, reading and reflective writing activities, a city-wide team and individual tennis tournament, a free LEGACY t-shirt and the opportunity to compete in the USTA's essay contest.

Each summer LEGACY's Community Tennis Summer Camp enrolls roughly 500 - 600 campers with each Site averaging 35 campers across 18 Sites throughout the City of Philadelphia.
